Mr. Singer,

I know you are very busy with your work, but I have to ask for advice and I will make sure to donate no matter what to your cause since there are no Rabbis around my location:

Ahead of time, I have watched your videos on people dealing with their christian family and it did not help very much for my case.

My entire family is catholic and they hold very anti-semitic beliefs, unconsciously. If I were to tell them any of what you have taught me about the idolatrous nature of christendom as a whole, my dad, especially, may have a heart attack since he grew up believing Jesus is God since he was young. I am 25, live in the United States, and highly family-oriented. My only other sibling, my brother, already died by suicide so my family is already distraught. Since you have dealt with people leaving christianity, is there any simple, one-sentence-like advice you can give me for dealing with a

family that is stuck in christianity and would not, they do not know that I am no longer a christian, be accepting of the fact that I want to be a Jew one day?

Again, I will make sure to donate to your work whether you have a piece of advice or not. I just do not know what to do and do not have any Jewish friends nor family to reach out to for advice. Also, this has been the biggest realization of my entire life and I feel like I have lived a lie for 25 years.
